CERVICARE INITIATIVE

Join Us in Protecting More Women Against Cervical Cancer

Cervical cancer is still a leading cause of death in rural India, especially where stigma, lack of awareness, and poor access to healthcare go hand in hand.

IDRF and **Arpana Trust** are implementing a cervical cancer prevention program in **Haryana** that helps raise awareness, provides early detection, and promotes the use of simple and efficient methods for detection.

Across 103 villages:

378 women were reached through door-to-door screening

154 tested

37 referred to hospitals for urgent care

And we are taking the next step: starting **HPV vaccinations for girls ages 8-14** to stop cervical cancer *before* it starts.



PATIENT ASSISTANT & DRIVE WITH PRIDE

Providing Livelihood Opportunities to School Dropouts and Disadvantaged

IDRF and Vatsalya Trust Mumbai provide training and certification to women to work as Patient and General Duty Assistants in hospitals, clinics and at-home care. **Since 2013, we have benefitted more than 1,150 women.**

We also provide training and licenses to drive 3-4-wheeler vehicles like autorickshaws, cabs, vans, etc. **Since 2018, we have benefitted more than 645 young men and women.**

Ambika, a mother left to care for her family after her husband passed away, learned about the Drive With Pride program from a friend. She signed up for the training, and started working as a driver for a school van. She is now able to financially support her family.

WHEELS FOR EDUCATION

Improving Access to Education by Providing Bicycles to Rural Students

Most students in rural India are economically disadvantaged and cannot afford to take public or private transport to school. For many children, particularly girls, riding a bicycle is a practical way to get to school, enabling them to skip long, exhausting walks and commute farther for greater chances. Many students, however, lack the funds to purchase bicycles for convenient and safe commutes.

IDRF provided 80 bicycles to students at the **Saraswati Vidya Mandir School (SKKS)** in Ghaziabad, **Uttar Pradesh**, at the cost of \$100 per bicycle. Your generosity will help us continue providing bicycles to more students

Preparing Young Adults Transitioning Out of Orphanages For a Bright Future

IDRF and California-based A Future for Every Child (AFEC) support **Catalyst for Social Action's** program that provides higher education or livelihood training to 51 youths aging out of orphanages in **Karnataka**. The beneficiaries receive assistance with education, career advice, and mentorship to make sure they are headed in the right direction.
