In 2020, when the USA faced a heart-wrenching situation due to the COVID-19 outbreak, IDRF joined hands with the Indian-American community and local organizations to provide relief to the struggling families in the Washington DC metro area (page 13). During times of humanitarian crises, IDRF has always extended a helping hand to the needy in the United States as well. During the spike in coronavirus cases in the second wave in India, IDRF is providing relief through groceries, oxygen concentrators, ventilators, other medical supplies, managing vaccination centers, and transporting people living in far-flung areas to the vaccination centers.

During these challenging times, when the poor need your help more than ever, I hope you will continue your valuable support to IDRF. Your help will enable us to continue the ongoing programs and start new projects while providing relief to those hit hardest by the pandemic.







## Our Program Sites




**\$1.76 million Disbursed in Grants**

# Mission and Strategy in Action-I

In 1988, a World Bank retiree Dr. Vinod Prakash and his wife Sarla, set up IDRF with the mission to break the cycle of poverty in India. Since then the evaluation and monitoring process ensures that grants are awarded to NGOs that demonstrate successful track records, maintain financial accountability, serve people regardless of religion or caste, and are approved to receive funds from overseas under the Govt. of India Foreign Contribution Regulation Act (FCRA). Grants are disbursed after due diligence to NGOs in India, and more recently in Nepal and Sri Lanka that implement grassroots programs for the underserved.

IDRF offers a **platform** to you to fulfil your dream of 'Giving back'. We provide "**Donor Advised and Funded**" projects for causes dear to your heart or in the memory of a loved one. Funds are disbursed on a project basis for the most effective and efficient use. Most projects are co-financed by the NGOs and beneficiaries, with the ultimate goal of becoming self-sustaining. We remain in direct contact with the NGOs and receive periodic reports and financial utilization of the funds. Our Board members, staff, donors, and volunteers are encouraged to visit the sites of the project.



# Mission and Strategy in Action-II



## Our Journey with Vivekananda Kendra Kanyakumari

IDRF's partnership with Vivekananda Kendra-a pan-India organization spreading Swami Vivekananda's message of "service to humanity, is service to God" started in the early 1990s. IDRF supported the [renovation of the Vivekananda Rock Memorial](#), Kanyakumari, where he is believed to have attained enlightenment. IDRF started supporting various [Arun Jyoti activities](#) aimed at the development of the marginalized communities in Arunachal Pradesh and Assam.



Primary health services were provided to the people in remote villages of the Himalayas along the Indo-Myanmar border. The medical teams were operating on foot in rough terrain and IDRF provided them a [medical van](#) in 1999. Since then three more medical vans have been provided that have benefitted more than 50,000 people from 40 villages in Assam and Arunachal Pradesh.

IDRF established [Rural Area Medical Aid \(RAMA\)](#), whereby, member doctors in the USA, donate \$1,000 each/year to cover the operating costs of the medical vans. Several members have volunteered in the [mobile medical camps](#) in Assam. The experience of these doctors inspired us to construct a fixed-location [OPD-pathology laboratory](#) in 2019 and started the construction of an [Operation Theater](#) in Tinsukia, Assam.



In 2006-2007, IDRF extended its support to Vivekananda International Foundation in New Delhi, by providing a [state-of-the-art library](#), [seminar hall](#), and [guest rooms](#). In 2009, IDRF supported the construction of a [multi-purpose building](#) in Guwahati.

In 2018, a 3-year "[Project Poshan](#)" was started to provide healthy meals and supplements to 600 malnourished children in Arunachal Pradesh. In 2020, "[Mission Shakti](#)" - a 2-year project was started to eradicate anemia among 1,000 young women in Assam and Arunachal Pradesh. As we move forward in our journey with Vivekananda Kendra, a senior dental surgeon has joined the medical team and [dental care](#) is also now offered through the OPD at Tinsukia. [Read more](#)

IDRF and Bodh Shiksha Samiti provide free child-centered education to underserved children. During the pandemic, an in-person homeschooling program was initiated and study kits were provided every two weeks in small groups in the areas around Jaipur.

### Construction of a hospital for poor patients, Telangana -Sahaj Seva Samsthan

IDRF is helping Sahaj Seva Samsthan construct a small hospital in Hyderabad for offering quality medical services. The construction started in 2020 and by May 2021 it will be ready to start services for the patients. [Read more](#)

IDRF in partnership with Arpana and Association for Democratic and Inclusive Governance is empowering women by training and creating financial security through Self-Help Groups by investing in income-generating activities. Women are also actively involved in village development issues like poverty alleviation, community health, and social justice. [Read more](#)

### 4. Eco-friendly Developments

#### Biogas plant at IDRF-tribal girls' hostel, Uttar Pradesh

IDRF has supported the installation of a two-unit biogas plant on the 20-acres education campus in Hapur. The plant runs on human and animal waste and meets the fuel needs in the kitchen at the hostel with 66 girls.



*Clean energy from the biogas plant replaces 57 LPG cylinders per year*

#### Desilting ponds to collect water through rainwater harvesting, Tamil Nadu and Gujarat

IDRF supports the desilting of ponds to provide water for household use in villages with water shortages. Ponds choked with silt and weed are dug up and any obstructions to water flow are removed and rainwater starts collecting in them. [Read more](#)

## 5. Good Governance

### Strengthening Municipal Reforms for implementing improved quality of public services, Odisha

#### -Janaagraha Center for Citizenship & Democracy

IDRF has partnered with Janaagraha, the Odisha government, and Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation for 3 years to strengthen cities by improving municipal finances, staffing/capacities, and citizen engagement. The project is also involved in the state's JAGA Mission for denotification of over 2,000+ slums into regular city neighborhoods through infrastructure and service development.

IDRF is helping bring about community empowerment to increase economic opportunities and the social reintegration of **9,187 beneficiaries from 20 villages** into the local communities (2018-2021).

## 6. Disaster Relief and Rehabilitation

### COVID-19 relief in India

IDRF sent more than \$127,000 in 2020 to provide relief to the needy during the pandemic. Medicines, PPEs, and food were provided to medical personnel and patients. Thousands of

migrant workers were provided snacks, meals, water bottles, face masks, and sanitizers at the checkpoints while traveling back home. [Read more](#)

IDRF supports Jnana Prabodhini in empowering tribal women through self-help groups and micro-loans to start up small enterprises to supplement their household incomes. The Thattes visited Jnana Prabodhini and were given a tour of the facility.

They also visited Lila Poonawalla Foundation that IDRF supports by providing scholarships for higher education to academically meritorious but financially weak women.

## Special Events & Awards



### COVID-19 relief program in the USA

During the pandemic in the United States, IDRF partnered with local organizations and provided \$67,155 and groceries in kind worth around \$200,000 to help those in distress. IDRF joined hands with the Indian-American organizations, local communities, and 20 other organizations like Montgomery County (MD) government, Montgomery County Public Schools, Montgomery College, Meals on Wheels, food banks, and diverse religious organizations, etc. in the Washington DC Metro area to provide food to the families hit hardest. Montgomery County Council, Maryland awarded a citation to IDRF on August 15<sup>th</sup>, for its commendable relief work done to serve the multi-cultural and diverse communities in the Washington DC Metro Area during the challenging times.

## **Creating livelihood and self-employment opportunities for people with disabilities in rural communities, Haryana**

IDRF in partnership with **Arpana Research and Charities Trust** is starting a 2-year project (April 2021-March 2023) in Karnal district for the integrated development, empowerment, and improvement of the quality of life of 300 differently-abled persons. The project will cost about \$12,000 per year to train and provide revolving micro-loans to create self-employment opportunities.

## **Providing equipment for an operation theater at a charitable eye hospital, Telangana**

IDRF's partner **Lions Club of Hyderabad-Meerpet Charitable** runs an eye hospital in Hyderabad and adding two operation theaters to increase the capacity of cataract surgeries to 10,000 per year. IDRF is helping raise \$18,500 to equip one of the modular operation theaters where the surgeries for the poor patients will be done free of cost.

## **Solar capacity building programs for unemployed rural youth, Uttar Pradesh**

IDRF in partnership with **SCALE** is expanding its solar capacity building program for unemployed rural youth in NOIDA. 40 participants will be trained in the production and maintenance of solar lights, plants, and pumps, etc. This skill-building will open up more income generation activities. The training program in four batches will cost \$11,000.

## **The revival of cultivation and consumption of flaxseeds by small and marginal dryland farmers, Maharashtra**

Dryland farmers in the eastern Vidarbha region are under a deep financial crisis. IDRF in partnership with **Magan Sangrahalaya Samiti** is starting a 3-year project to help 1,500 farmers from 150 villages to revert to the farming of flaxseeds. About 2,000 acres of land will yield more than 10,000 quintals of flaxseeds and give a considerable economic boost to farmers. Best farming techniques will be taught to the farmers and enterprises set up to make flaxseeds products. The total cost of this project will be \$28,000.
